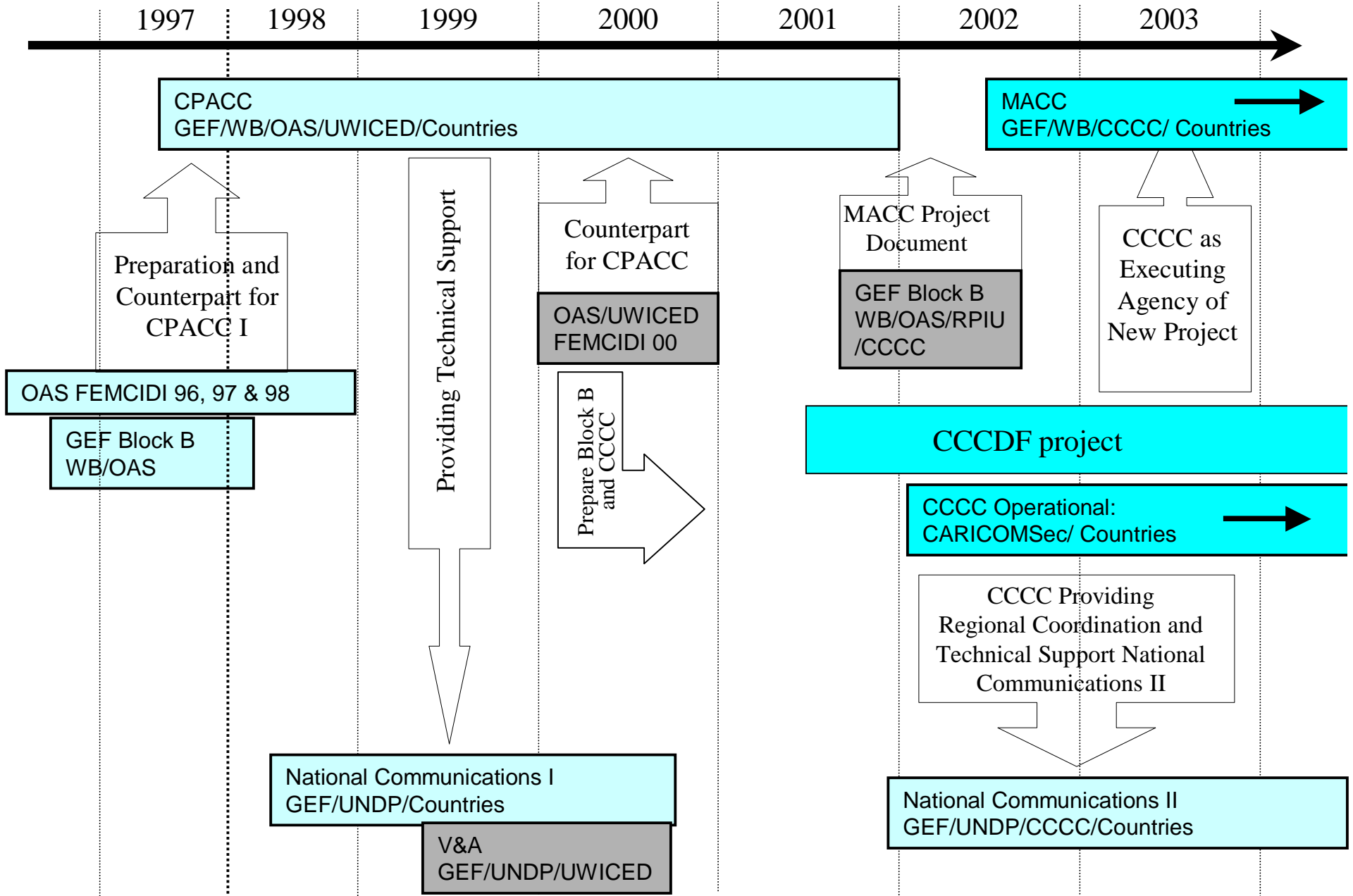

Mainstreaming Adaptation to Climate Change: MACC

PDF-B Preparation Process

- **Finalize PDF-B proposal for approval by GEF Council (May 2001)**
- Prepare MACC Project Document (July 2001 - May 2002)
- MACC Project Concept Document (PCD) in World Bank pipeline (August 2001)
- End of CPACC (December 2001)
- Establish Climate Change Center (March 2002)
- MACC implementation (July 2002 - December 2006)

PDF Block B: Objectives

- Support national and regional consultations on priorities for inclusion in MACC
- Carry out special studies
- Prepare public education and awareness strategy for key economic sectors and national development policy
- Formulate project document (activities, scopes of work, budget, institutional framework)

PDF Block B: Timeline

- Sign agreement with World Bank July 01
- Regional consultation of Focal Points Aug 01
- National NICU consultations Aug-Dec 01
- Activity reviews and special studies Aug-Dec 01
- Consultation with regional agencies Nov 01
- Design of MACC components Nov01-Feb02
- Regional consultation of focal points Mar 02

PDF Block B: Budget

- Coordination	\$40,000
- Consultation process	\$110,000
- Reviews and Studies	\$120,000
- Project Document	\$75,000
TOTAL	\$345,000

Institutional Arrangements

- **FDF-B: Same as with CPACC**

OAS and CPACC/RPIU will be executing agency for World Bank as GEF implementing agency

- **MACC: Transfer of responsibility**

Caribbean Climate Change Center will be executing agency of MACC for the World Bank.
OAS will provide technical support to CCCC.

MACC

Mainstreaming Adaptation to Climate Change in the Caribbean

- Incorporate adaptation in national and sectoral planning, and in public and private investment decisions
- Support and coordinate preparation of 2nd National Communications (collaboration with UNDP)
- Feasibility studies of demonstration projects for stage II adaptation responses
- Expand vulnerability assessments to all key sectors
- Expand CC monitoring and research, including downscaling of global models
- Cross-regional dissemination and replication
